Here are some suggestions of positive action you can take:

- Donate to one of the many charities supporting bushfire relief
- Visit a bushfire affected community when it is safe to do so and support their local businesses
- Take action – find the cause or organisation you are passionate about that is contributing to social and environmental justice and then dedicate what you can to that cause every week
- Write to your local Member of Parliament, the Prime Minister, the Leader of the Opposition. Write to anyone who has influence and demand action to address climate change now
- Engage in your local community – speak with neighbours, find out what they care about and how you can work together. Learn about local sustainability initiatives. Build networks and harness that energy
- Be an advocate for reconciliation and justice for First Nations Peoples. Ensure the knowledge and wisdom of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, who cared for this land for tens of thousands of years, is listened to, valued and acted on
